Mr Sharma works at Peterborough and Stamford Hospitals, and at Stamford runs a "one stop haematuria [blood in the urine] clinic which allows the rapid assessment of patients with this common and worrying symptom. This is one of the many much valued services offered by the Hospital and promises to be a very interesting talk. Mr Sharma was nominated at a recent awards ceremony held by the Hospital's Trust as the "Stamford Hospital Hero" on account of his supportiveness, kindness and great sense of humour.

"The Story of Stamford Hospital: as told in the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries"

This is the title of the new book we will be publishing shortly. It consists of a reproduction of two previous histories of the Hospital with an additional account of the last 40 years. The first history was written in 1879 by William Newman, one of the surgeons at the Hospital at that time. There are few surviving copies of this history. It gives a very interesting account of the early days of the Hospital and of the nature of health care in the 19th century. We feel it important to preserve this account by reproducing it in a book.

The second history was published as a pamphlet in 1978 by the Friends of the Hospital to mark the 150th anniversary of the Hospital. Again few copies remain and it is an important account that should be preserved.

In addition to the above we have brought the story up to date by describing events since 1978. Also included in the book will be a selection from the Hospital's fascinating archive.



We expect this book will be published soon and we will let you know when that happens. Any profits from sales will go to the Friends to support the Hospital. The main purpose of the book is however to help promote interest in the Hospital and remind people of the great benefit it has given, and continues to give, to Stamford and the local area.

I do hope we will see you at the AGM.
