You will see from the photo below, that the building had just two floors in 1939 but by the 1960's such was the demand for student nursing places, the building was extended to four floors!





Requests for funding for items has been somewhat slow following the easing of Covid restrictions at the hospital. The focus has been on reinstating services and all departments are becoming busier, so we are hoping for more requests in the future. We have provided funding for equipment in the Physiotherapy department. This is being used in the rehabilitation of children, patients with musculoskeletal problems and those with neurological conditions. We have also recently approved a further £12,000 funding on some additional equipment for the ultrasound and MRI department.

Now some less happy news. Mike Dronfield, our Chair of 28 years, has decided to stand down and retire as a Trustee. I am sure many of you know Mike and will agree he has been an outstanding Chair and hard working link with the Trust. ## Digital Antenatal Care: The Art of the Possible

Michael Lumb was a Consultant Obstetrician & Gynaecologist at Peterborough and Stamford for twentyfive years, retiring in July 2021. He has been interested in using computers in healthcare since he was a medical student and was a Research Fellow at the University of Cambridge for two years during his training. He became the first Chief Clinical Information Officer at NWAFT from 2017. At the start of the pandemic he used digital technology to largely virtualise his antenatal clinics with distinct advantages for his patients. Kerry will talk about advances in digital healthcare technology in General Practice.
